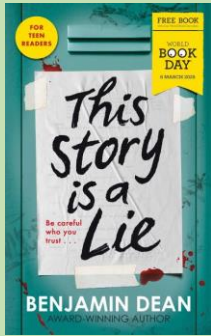




Livo Loves Reading
