Provision 2016-17	 Catch-up premium used to create additional classes to enable learners eligible for catch-up funding to be placed in small sets. Gaps in knowledge and skills identified from KS2 QLA from Raise Quality First Teaching strategies embedded to accelerate progress Focus on the development of literacy skills through the use of Literacy Progress Units TA support in class Small group intervention and one to one intervention sessions for students using LEXIA
