


# **Livo Loves Reading**

#### Today we interviewed Miss Rainbow

What do you love about reading? I love how a book can give you complete escapism! In a matter of minutes, I can be in the Victorian era, in the middle of a battle or fighting demons through witchcraft and wizardry! What was your favourite book when you were younger? I used to love reading 'The Worst Witch' series. I still love stories that delve into magic and the mischief that will always arise from it. I suppose it was my 'Harry Potter' series all those years ago, but of course, it didn't even exist then! <u>What are you currently reading?</u> I am currently reading a book called 'The Doll Factory'; it's thrilling, creepy and leaves me in a state of suspense at the end of each chapter. It is a piece of historical fiction – my favourite genre – and I transport back to London in the 1850s with every page. Reading Advice for students If you are not someone to pick up a book yourself, but you like stories, don't underestimate the joy of audio books! I often listen to stories on my way home from school to help me to 'wind down' after a busy day. If I am tired, I often prefer the sound of a story being nice to have a dramatic reading with accents to follow along to. I love reading, but I equally love listening to them.
